This stunning photo exhibit showcases more than 70 intimate and iconic images of President John F. Kennedy and his family taken by Kennedy's personal photographer, Jacques Lowe.

Lowe's photographs of the Kennedys helped create the legend of the Kennedy presidency known as “Camelot.” His extraordinary access to Kennedy's private and public life allowed him to capture events that others could not. Lowe's photos document Kennedy's rise to power, from his 1958 Senate re-election campaign to the White House, along with intimate scenes of the Kennedys at home. The exhibit also explores how Lowe's images were used in the news media.

More than 40,000 of Lowe’s negatives of the Kennedy family were lost in the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks in New York. To produce this exhibit, the Newseum digitally scanned and restored more than 70 of Lowe’s images to their original color, content and clarity using prints and contact sheets from Lowe’s estate. This exhibit marks the first time that many of these images have been seen in their original condition in more than 50 years.

A large touch-screen monitor allows visitors to view more than two dozen of Lowe’s original contact sheets, including the editing marks that indicate the images he selected for publication in various newspapers and magazines. The exhibit also includes an original Newseum-produced film about Jacques Lowe and the Kennedy family.



THE EXHIBITION INCLUDES:

- 400 linear feet of exhibit content
- 14 oversized image panels
- 69 color and black-and-white framed photographs with labels
- 13 supporting story panels
- Nine wall cases to display 11 historic magazines that feature Lowe's Kennedy photographs, including *Look*, *Paris Match*, *Ladies' Home Journal* and *Newsweek*
- A self-contained video monitor with an original Newseum-produced film about Jacques Lowe and the Kennedy family
- A self-contained interactive touch-screen monitor that allows visitors to explore and zoom in on Lowe's contact sheets
